Minutes was discussed from last September and nothing was outstanding.

### Bylaws

Jack Moron requested Mike Logan and Jack Baugher sign the By Laws that was approved last year.

### Taxes/Certificate of Incorporation/Tax Exemption

Mike Perryman reviewed our approved 2018 Internal Revenue tax exempt form 501c7. He noted that donors cannot deduct contributions they make to ISCA under IRC section 170. Jim McNutt will submit the required Form 990/990-EZ/990-N. Mike also received a letter from Internal Revenue regarding our Certificate of Incorporation for 2018.

### Election Process –

Mike P. talked about the ISCA by laws and officer positions serve 2 years this includes the President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary. Officers area approaching the end of the two years and are up for election at the end of this cycle. It doesn't work having an annual meeting at the state shoot. Shooters

want to shoot and attendance for a meeting would be low. Our By-laws and NSCA requires us to have an annual meeting. Mike will email out a notice with duties and give it two weeks for nominations. Nominations will be sent to Lisa and she will create a ballot and then we will have another two weeks to vote. We can vote electronically and get it done.

Lisa & Jim both mentioned they are interested in exiting their board positions. Jim said he tried leaving last time, but that didn't work out. Lisa commented that life was just getting busy as the family was growing.

Mike talked about Ken Layton's email from last fall regarding the president being on the board for one year before becoming the president. Ken thought we were limiting our pool. Kyle asked if the year could be any year and not previous year. Everyone agreed. Jim mentioned that he liked it and he would like to be able to amend it if someone from the youth stepped up. Mike L. mentioned at first, he agreed with Ken, but now being here he says that they need to be involved in the ISCA board to be president.

Kyle asked with the pass of the officers would take place. Mike P. suggested that after the state shoot. Then both officers can assist and the exiting officers can work with the new officers.

Mike P. talked about that we know we have two positions available and if we know people let's recruit them.

## **Annual Meeting**

Mike P. suggested that we have our annual meeting soon and it was discussed to have it at Indian Creek at their March shoot on 03/17. It would get shooters to the location of the 2018 Indiana State Shoot.

## **State shoot**

Jason started off talking about golf carts and the state shoot and he has a local company that will be providing them and meeting their needs.

Jason passed out a flyer that he created on the Indiana State Sporting Clays Championship June 28<sup>th</sup> & July 1<sup>st</sup> at Indian Creek. (see attached)

Mike talked about purse that he thought it was lower than what he had for the last two years at Indiana Gun Club. This \$5,000 in payout listed is only the portion that is coming from Jason. Jason mentioned there wasn't anything listed for Sub Jr & Jr for purse. Mike said in the past we haven't had a purse for the juniors just trophies. There was discussion was around jr and sub jr. They can bet any options and can win the purse.

It was discussed about the NSCA fees being added at registration. Kyle verified the increase to 3 cents for ISCA fees wasn't updated in Winscore. Jason will get with Mike Hafley to get this updated as soon as possible.

Mike P. mentioned that he will take the information from Jason's flyer and put it in format. He will add the ISCA donations/prizes to the flyer too. ISCA will be giving away 28 flats for shoots off and will take care of the Friday night and Saturday night shoot offs. ISCA will provide t-shirts for all main event shooters,

concurrent purse, trophies, and add to main event purse, plus door prizes, and dinner. He will add Indian Creek logo and once done share.

Mike mentioned that the last two years he paid for the worker shirts. He told Jason if they want to piggy back state shoot shirts in a different color let me know shirt sizes.

Mike also mentioned that he has seen Indiana State Shoot shirts all over at shoots in Indiana and out of Indiana. This year Mike will have time to work on sponsors for the shirts that could possible pay for the shirts with their logos on the back.

Jason mentioned that he can buy flats for \$50 Flocchi in large quantities. Everyone agreed that when the time comes to go ahead and order flats at a good price through Jason for the state shoot. That way they are there and ISCA doesn't have to transport them too.

Jason shared his layout for events on his property too. The State Shoot Committee would meet after this meeting and they would go into more details with him.

Mike P. mentioned the only difference with the events listed was Jason had a preliminary 5-stand listed and the state shoots the past two years did not have one.

Jason shared a menu for a catering with Sander Catering. He says they are used in his area a lot. Mike P. & Jack M. both mentioned that they would arrange as the ISCA. They didn't want Jason to have to worry about things that the ISCA would take care of for the shoot.

Jack M. and Kyle created a ISCA State Shoot Checklist (see attached) for due dates and if club or ISCA is taking care of the task. Kyle mentioned that this is the first year with the check list things can be added to the list as we need to help clubs in the future years. It is a way to make sure that everything gets done that needs to get done and that nothing is missed.

Jason mentioned that Mike Hafley will be the target setter and he also has a guy coming in from Texas. Mike P. commented that Hafley is a good target setter and that he can focus on the targets. Sara Hafley will be the score keeper too.

### **Target Setting School**

Mike P. passed out a flyer (see attached) on the target setting school that he took last year for everyone to have. If anyone is interested it is a good training.
